Conference on Critical Minerals and Metals (#CCMM) – Chicago

Funditec participated in Meetech Spain 2025, organized by Fedit. The event connected technology centres, companies, and researchers, showcasing the latest MaDiTraCe developments and turning industrial challenges into impactful solutions.



TWINVECTOR – European Project Final Conference

MaDiTraCe attended the final conference of our sister project, TWINVECTOR, focusing on next-generation batteries. Discussions centered on EU requirements for battery development and production from sustainability and safety to durability and efficiency.
